# Review

- ⦿ It's better to be wronged than to defame the name of Christ.
- ⦿ The church has wisdom to judge matters and guide according to God's truth.
- ⦿ Business conflict should reflect the same clear focus on truth, grace and understanding that God commands for interpersonal conflict.

# Biblical Help for Disappointing Relationships

- Sometimes, disappointments have clear, focused resolutions (e.g. sin confronted by church pursuit/discipline, which results in either repentance or disfellowship).
- Other times, relationships exist in the “gray areas” without as much driven resolution. How do we handle these situations?

# Identify Your Lord

- Galatians 1:10 – You cannot seek men’s ultimate favor and still serve Christ.
- 1 Corinthians 10:31 – Christians want to glorify Christ in everything.
- 1 Thessalonians 2:4 – We want to please the One Who judges our hearts.
- Luke 19:17 – We want to be commended as faithful slaves of God.
- One of the primary challenges of human relationships is seeking to honor men and women around us while obeying God. When the two conflict, we commit to obeying God.

# Keep Asking: Is There a Log In My Eye?

- Matthew 7:5 – “You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your brother’s eye.”
- Why does this keep coming up?
- Because, even when dealing with unsaved spouses, overbearing bosses, disobedient children and difficult friendships, we have the huge potential to sin.

# Keep Remembering: I Deserve Nothing

- ⦿ Philippians 2:5-6 – Christ did not hold on to His rights.
- ⦿ Philippians 2:7-8 – Christ chose humble servitude.
- ⦿ 1 Corinthians 9:12, 15 – Paul surrendered his rights in order to serve the churches.
- ⦿ If we truly desire to please God and not ourselves, many of our “needs” and “rights” fade in importance.
- ⦿ 1 Corinthians 4:5 – “...each man’s praise will come to him from God.”
- ⦿ By recognizing that everyone should be worshipping God, we stop demanding our own satisfaction from others.

# Patience for Growth

- ⦿ Sin – Failing to honor God by commission or omission
- ⦿ Growth – Acquiring and applying doctrine, resulting in well-trained character and actions that honor God
- ⦿ Growth is closely connected to one's tendency to sin, but they are not the same.
- ⦿ God is patient with sinners (1 Timothy 1:16).
- ⦿ He expects His servants to be patient while instructing others (1 Thessalonians 5:14, 2 Timothy 4:2).
- ⦿ Patience, however, is not an excuse to ignore a sinning brother or sister (e.g. 1 Corinthians 5:2, 2 Corinthians 11:19-21).

# Patience for People, Not Sin

- ◎ The church is called to patiently accept:
  - Those who have extra standards beyond Biblical absolutes (Romans 14:1)
  - Those who are weak and fainthearted in their Christian walk (1 Thessalonians 5:14)
  - Those who are out of line (1 Thessalonians 5:14)
  - All believers (Ephesians 4:1-2)
  - Unbelievers (cf. God's attitude in 2 Peter 3:9)
- ◎ The church cannot accept:
  - Open sin (1 Corinthians 5:1-2, 11)
  - False Doctrine (e.g. 2 Timothy 2:16-18)

# Exalt God, Not The Situation

- You might be frustrated that a difficult situation seems to be outside of your control.
- IT IS!!! (Ephesians 1:11)
- You might be frustrated that you can't change someone's mind, stop them from harming themselves and set them on the right path.
- YOU CAN'T!!! (Ephesians 1:11)
- God is the sole sovereign of these situations.
- If you are a believer, you can be confident that God's sovereignty means your benefit (Genesis 50:20, Romans 8:28).

# How to Exalt God in Trials

- Define what is good according to God's terms. Romans 8:29-30 says that God is on a mission to sanctify you.
- Delight in God's sovereignty by praising His wisdom and thanking Him for His care (e.g. Psalm 31:1-5).
- Depend on God's care through faithful prayer (1 Thessalonians 5:17, James 1:5-6).
- Delete any idea that you will accomplish anything profitable by your own strength (Psalm 90:17)
